Our main campus, nestled in the heart of North Bend at Si View Park, is more than just a park—it's the community's hub for connection, culture, and fun with a historic community center, indoor pool and multi-use sports fields and playgrounds. Our parks and programs create well-maintained open spaces, neighborhood connectivity, and healthy, vibrant lifestyles for everyone.

Whether you're looking for outdoor adventures or community events, Si View Metro Parks is where it all comes together.



The updated **Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PROS) Plan**, released in August, offers a strategic roadmap for delivering inclusive and resilient recreation services. Informed by extensive community engagement and technical analysis, the 2025 Plan prioritizes indoor and outdoor spaces, equitable access, and sustainable partnerships. It addresses geographic and demographic shifts to meet the evolving needs of the community.



During the nine-week school break, Si View Metro Parks delivered **98 exciting summer camp programs** for K-12 students—thanks to incredible partnerships with community instructors. From robotics and sports like volleyball, tennis, and golf to the ever-popular Si View Day Camps, kids had endless opportunities to learn, play, and grow. These programs brought families together, sparked creativity, and kept the Snoqualmie Valley active all summer long!



Also this summer, the **North Bend Farmers Market** celebrated its **20th season** at Si View Park, and it's thriving like never before! With record-breaking sales, stronger community ties, and a growing impact, the market continues to be a cornerstone of local life. A favorite feature? **The Power of Produce (POP) Club**—where kids dive into the local food system through hands-on activities with farmers, fun learning experiences, and tasting fresh, seasonal fruits and veggies. It's all about inspiring healthy habits and connecting families to fresh, local food.



Interest in **adult programs** is soaring—especially dance! **Line Dancing** has become a community favorite, taking over the gym as enrollment more than doubled this year. Other new offerings like **Zumba**, **Bollywood**, and **Dance Fitness** are bringing energy, culture, and excitement to every class where participants stay active, meet new friends and have fun on the dance floor.



Our sports community is buzzing with energy! **Youth Basketball & Adult Pickleball** lead the way on the sports courts. Demand for these programs is at an all-time high with 108 youth teams and 132 adult teams this year. Limited indoor court space means we've had to get creative with scheduling to ensure plenty of game time for everyone.



Early this year, the Si View Pool took a short break for a full month of repairs, but our programming hardly missed a beat! **Swim lessons** remain in high demand for all ages and abilities, and we're committed to meeting that need. New this year is an **Intro to Swim** course, designed for youth who are fearful of water, helping them build confidence and safety skills. For the more advanced swimmer, youth courses were revised to better prepare experienced swimmers for swim team.
