



2025 Highlights Projects in Review

Investing in Our Community's Future

Since 2003, Si View Metro Parks has been dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for Snoqualmie Valley residents through exceptional parks and recreation programs. Through strong partnerships and cooperative arrangements, we actively manage and schedule hundreds of acres of parks, trails, and open spaces, creating opportunities for both active and passive recreation. Guided by community priorities and funded by property taxes and earned revenue, we invest in capital projects that meet the growing recreation needs of our vibrant community—building spaces that connect neighborhoods, inspire healthy lifestyles, and strengthen community bonds.



Snoqualmie Valley Aquatics Collaborative (SVAC)

Created by unanimous resolution of the Si View Metropolitan Park District Commissioners, SVAC brings together elected representatives and community leaders to evaluate the need for a new public pool. Their mission is to balance community goals and concerns and recommend a path forward. The **2025 PROS Plan** ranks an indoor public pool as the top priority for investment.



New Community Park Master Plan

Planning began in June for a 6-acre community park, thanks to a generous land donation from the Snoqualmie Valley Riding Club. Community input will shape the amenities and recreation features for this exciting new space.



Administration Building Construction

Work started in spring on a new single-story office building that will consolidate administrative functions and provide public meeting space. Existing offices will be repurposed for community use.



South Fork Landing Master Plan – Phase I

Permitting is underway for Phase I development, following schematic designs for a formal park entrance and trail system.



Si View Park North Entrance Improvements

Construction broke ground in September to enhance connectivity, aesthetics, and pedestrian safety between Si View Park and William Henry Taylor Park. A new maintenance building will also provide space for equipment to maintain our growing parks inventory.



Regional Trail Connections

In partnership with Washington State DNR and Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance, construction is underway on a trail linking **Tennant Trailhead Park to Snoqualmie Point Park**, Raging River State Forest, and Rattlesnake Mountain Scenic Area. Two large bridges were delivered by helicopter in August!

Open Space Preservation & Future Trails

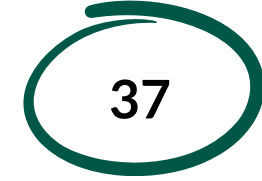

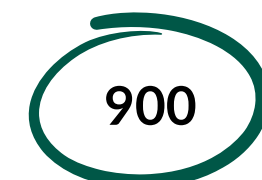
Grant funds allocated to capital projects



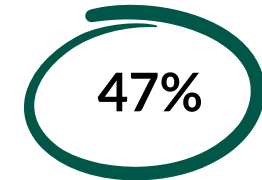
Full time equivalent jobs
